Research during the COVID-19 pandemic

Health research has been vital during the COVID-19 pandemic.

At East Lancashire Hospitals NHS Trust (ELHT) we are part of the national research effort to prevent, diagnose and treat COVID-19. The research is helping us to learn more about the illness, which people are most at risk, and what treatments benefit those affected. East Lancashire patients and our clinical and research staff have been playing their part by supporting national, high-priority research studies within our hospitals.

Research into other conditions

In accordance with <u>quidelines</u> from the Department of Health and Social Care and the National Institute for Health Research, we temporarily paused the entry of patients into the research studies that were taking place before the COVID-19 outbreak. This was to keep patients safe and to ensure that members of the research team were available to support clinical services and COVID-19 research.

Restarting research

Our efforts to tackle the pandemic continue but to advance care and treatment for East Lancashire patients across a range of health conditions, we are now restarting the research which was taking place prior to the COVID-19 outbreak. We are working closely with research sponsors to achieve this, and where clinical services are available for us to deliver the research.
